This pattern was created by Jack Dennis at the request of his wife and his friend Dick Cheney who planned to enter the Jackson Hole One Fly contest in 1999. The fly was the winner in 1999 and 2000. It is a stonefly pattern based on three flies, Amy's Golden Stone, Chernobyl ant and the Chocolate Ant.

Materials:	State of the second sec
Thread:	6/0, 140 denier thread, tan or brown
Hook:	#6 to #12 Tiemco 5262 or 5263 hook
Underbody:	2 mm tan foam
Overbody:	2 mm brown foam
Legs:	Brown medium round rubber legs
Hackle:	Grey, brown saddle hackle
Body:	Olive Krystal Chenille
Underwing:	Rainbow Krystal Flash
Overwing:	Elk or deer hair

Bass Gurgler - Featured Tyer, Joe Tremblay

Ever want to tie a bass size popper but didn't have popper heads on hand? Well here's a very effective bass bug on you can make using craft foam, some marabou, chenille, rubber legs and a bit of flash.

Materials:

Thread:	Olive Woolly Nylon or 3/0 tying
Hook:	#4 Saber 7060 Bass Bug/Salmon hook
Weed Guard:	Mason Hard Mono 16lbs
Body:	2 or 3mm craft foam, med Palmer Chenille
	@ rubber legs
Eyes:	Plastic peg eyes (optional)
Legs:	Rubber legs
Tail:	Marabou, Flashabou @ rubber legs

Trout Fishing at Madison County Public Fishing Lake Begins Nov. 27

Trout season at Madison County Public Fishing Lake will open Friday, November 27, 2020. During the season, the Alabama Division of Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries (WFF) will stock more than 3,000 pounds of rainbow trout ranging in size from 1 to 2 pounds. The daily creel limit is four trout per angler. A \$5 Daily Trout Permit is required in addition to a valid freshwater fishing license in order to fish for trout. Trout anglers may also fish for bass, bluegill, catfish and crappie. Anglers can purchase their freshwater fishing licenses at various license vendors throughout the state or online at www.outdooralabama.com. - 1-2 packs of SNACKS/DESSERT




