

June 13th, 7 PM Wiggle Damsel Fly – Lead Tyer, Andy King ^{Cost: \$3.00}

This is a great little articulated damselfly nymph pattern, made from a single material. Charlie Craven walks us through how to tie this little fly. Video can be seen <u>here</u>.

Materials

Size 14 hook, Straight eye, 1X fine, Wide gap Size 14 hook, Sproat bend, Down eye Eye: Black X-Small bead chain Tail and Body: Olive Marabou 3X tippet Thread: Olive 70 8/0 uni

Stealth Bomber – Lead Tyer, Connor Baker Cost \$3.00


A good Southeastern warm water pattern invented by Georgia fishing guide, Kent Edmonds. This is a topwater fly, designed to get the attention of bass by stirring up the water and making a lot of bubbles.

Materials

Hook: Gamakatsu B10S various sizes Tail: Bucktail Flash: Pearl Flashabou Foam: 2 mm foam Body: Cactus Chenille Legs: Barred rubber legs Thread: 210 denier (white, or whatever color you have)

All are welcome! Fly tying equipment is available for new tyers. Come and discover the joy of catching fish on a fly you tied or, better yet, one of your own design. The sessions are the 2nd and 4th Thursdays at 7 p.m.








Fishing With Kids

June is really the start of Summer. The warm weather is prime for fishing and the days are longer, giving you more daylight to fish. Additionally, starting in mid-May or early June, school let's out and your kids (or grandkids) are home. Taking them fishing is something that can create life long memories, and a life long love of the outdoors and adventure. Presented by Redington, Fly Lords Magazine published some good tips for taking your kids fishing. The tips are below, but the entire article can be found here.

Tip 1: Pack Those Snacks

Just like us adults, kids get hungry when fishing. The difference is, they are growing and need proper nutrients. On top of that, they might get "hangry". Bring some fruit, juice, trail mix, anything to snack on. Maybe even bring their favorite candy. A hungry kid can end your day of fishing really quick.

Tip 2: Grab a Kid-Friendly Camera

If you take your kid fishing, it will be a memory you won't want to forget. Make sure to take a lot of pictures. Bring one that is easy for them to use, and kid friendly. They will take pictures you didn't expect and it will be fun to look back on. Additionally, you don't want them using your expensive camera that could get broken.

Tip 3: Bring Extra Clothes

Kids love to play hard. They roll around in the mud, pick up rocks, and just do kid things. If they fall in the water and get wet, or fall in the mud, it is important to have some extra clothes. Socks, shorts, shirts, all of that is essential to have extras of. Make sure to also bring a towel!

Tip 4: Let Them Cast How They Want to

The mechanics of casting a fly rod is tricky. It takes adults a few outings to get the hang of it. Bringing a young child and trying to force perfect casting on them is going to be a losing endeavor. Give them some instruction, but let them really cast on their own. They might not catch as much fish, but will have fun.

Tip 5: Drop Those Expectations

Fly fishing with kids is much different than fly fishing with friends. They are not going to be able to grasp every concept right away. Be patient and just have fun. You don't always have to catch a fish to enjoy fishing. Just be happy you aren't at work and can enjoy nature.
