## Rhonda Page, Tim's Flies and Lies

Our February speaker is Tennessee businesswoman Rhonda Page of Tim's Flies and Lies Outfitters - Full Service Fly Shop (Facebook) near Normandy and Tullahoma, Tennessee. Long-time Elk and Duck rivers fisherman Tim Page opened Tim's Flies and Lies Outfitters 20 years ago. Rhonda took over management in 2007 when Tim returned to his career of electrical maintenance management. Rhonda said Tim gave her a "crash course" in fly tying that she also learned through trial and error with help from "her fabulous client base and close fishing friends." The Pages moved their fly shop to their current location near Normandy and Tullahoma where they focus on fishing gear and fly tying. The shop is open by appointment. Rhonda stays in contact with the Tennessee Valley Authority, Tennessee Wildlife Resource Agency, and Dale Hollow for stocking and water release information.

The speaker will join us via Zoom. You will receive the Zoom invitation the week of the meeting.

# Feb. 10, 7 PM EZ Parachute Adams – Lead Tyer, Joe Tremblay

Cost: \$2.00 in person

The Parachute Adams is one of the most popular patterns in fly fishing history, simply because it works! The Adams is tied in sizes 12 down to 26 and catches everything from bream to the most discriminating of trout. As the name implies this version uses several techniques that simplifies the tying process.



#### Materials:

Thread: 6/0 grey or black

**Tail:** Coq De Leon **Post:** Para post

Other: Brown Sharpie

Hook: #12 dry fly hook

Body: Super Fine Dry Fly Dubbing - Adam's Gray

Hackle: Grizzly dry fly hackle

### Feb. 24th, 7 PM

#### Prince Nymph, Lead Tyer - Steve Kerkhof

This is a traditional trout pattern created by Doug Prince in the 1930's. We will tie it with a bead head. The fly uses goose biots for the tail and "wings".

#### **Materials:**

Thread: Black 8/0

Hook: Nymph Hook, Size 12 or 14, 2X Long"

Head: 1/8"(3.2mm) gold bead

Tail: Brown biot

Body: Peacock hearl, 3 or 4 strands, Oval French tinsel

for the rib

**Other:** White biot goose feather **Weight:** Lead wire (optional)

## Fish of the Month



TVFF member Connor Baker caught the above trout at Sipsey Fork on a cold Saturday morning. It was one of seven similar fish. The fish was caught using a 6'9" 3wt fiberglass rod. It was either caught on a size 18 Zebra Midge, or a size 16 Hare's Ear Nymph. Both were tied on, but Connor cannot remember which one actually caught the fish!

## **January TVFF Recap**

#### January 20 - Club Meeting

Cody Fischer, owner of Tellico Outfitters in Tellico Plains, Tenn., and our January guest speaker, gave TVFF members an overview of fishing in the Tellico River and tributaries located northeast of Chattanooga. Fischer said the river system harbors both native and stocked brook, brown, and rainbow trout. "A lot of people are surprised that the Tellico has wild fish," Fischer said. Wild browns can be found but their rarity makes them a prize. In the Tellico River's lower reaches, smallmouth can be found.

The area has 300-plus miles of trout streams, including special regulation streams and closed-season versus open waters. See the Tennessee Wildlife Resource Agency for the exact regulations. In some areas, a daily trout permit is required between March 1 and Sept. 30.

Fischer grew up in southern Illinois, began fly fishing in South Dakota and began guiding for the local fly shop. Cody and his wife, Abby, moved to East Tennessee in 2018 and the next year he opened, <u>Tellico Outfitters</u> a full-service fly shop in downtown Tellico Springs.






## **January Fly Tying**

### 7 Fly Fishing Traveling Tips - Flylords

One fun aspect of fly fishing is traveling to new places and targeting unique fish. However, a big trip can be difficult to plan and pack for. Often gear is forgotten or the wrong gear brought instead. Jake Lebsack of Flylords put out an article with 7 fly fishing tips for travelers. A paraphrased version of the article is below. - **1. Be a List Maker** Make a list, add to it and check it. Seeing everything on paper will make it easier to determine what you actually need. It will help avoid underpacking or overpacking.
- 2. Use the Right Luggage If transporting something valuable, like your flyrod, make sure it is secure. Don't just throw it in a duffel bag!
- **3.** Pack Smart Organization can save you headache later! Keep your fishing gear separate from your regular clothes, it will make it easier to access when you need it. Zip lock bags can be useful when organizing.
- **4.** Carry it On Carry on as much gear as you can! It will be available quicker and there is no chance it will get lost in transit. Also, better to keep your fishing gear with you, so that it doesn't get damaged.
- **5. Stay Charged** Purchase a portable charger! Phones/digital cameras are a big part of fishing. Need to get a picture of your fish to prove you caught it! If battery runs out, then some of those memories can't be documented.
- **6. Consider Insurance** Accidents happen fly fishing. If traveling to a remote area, health insurance is important. Also, look in to other types of insurance. Insurance can cover things like cancelled trips and stolen/broken property.
- 7. Enjoy the Journey A big trip doesn't happen often. Enjoy it and appreciate being away on an adventure!

Whether you are planning a trip to Florida this winter, or a big trip to Alaska in the summer, these tips will help you get the most out of your trip.





#### **Trout Stocked at Madison County Public Fishing Lake**

Trout fishing season at Madison County Public Fishing Lake (PFL) will begin on Friday, November 26, 2021. The Division of Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries plans to stock over 3,000 pounds of rainbow trout in Madison County PFL during the trout season with trout ranging in size from one to two pounds. A \$5.00 Daily Trout Permit in addition to a valid freshwater fishing license is required to fish for trout. Trout anglers may also fish for bass, bluegill, catfish, and crappie. The daily creel limit is 4 trout per angler. Check their website for directions and hours of operation, which are limited, so check before you go.




#### **Trout in Gadsden**

Trout season began October 15<sup>th</sup> on Black Creek, Noccalula Falls near Gadsden, AL. Check the link for more details.

A separate permit is required for \$10 per day or \$35 for the season. It is a delayed harvest stream, catch and release from October  $15^{th}$  – April  $30^{th}$ , and a five fish limit from May  $1^{st}$  – June  $30^{th}$ . Fly rods only, barbless hooks, artificial lures only.





#### 2022 Fly Fishing Show - Atlanta, GA

After being cancelled in 2021, the Fly Fishing Show is back in Atlanta! The largest fly fishing symposium of its kind, Atlanta is the only Southeastern State that will host this year. Exhibitors will include fishing guides, famous fly tyers, fly shops, et al. FFI is providing free fly fishing instruction and if you are interested there will be a film festival Friday night.

Two years ago, I met my cousin from Georgia at the show. It was a really fun time. There were hundreds of exhibitors from all over.

Anything from fishing lodges in Canada, to local guides in Atlanta.


There is a huge section for fly tyers. FFI has free instruction, but there are some neat classes you can pay for. My cousin and I took an entomology class from a PhD candidate at Clemson. He taught us about various aquatic insects and how to take samples. It was a pretty fun time, I think anyone with interest in fly fishing would have fun.



FTW will be back inside the warm and comfortable conference center at Tremont Lodge and Resort in beautiful Townsend on the west side of the stunningly gorgeous Smoky Mountains. Just in case you get the fishing bug (OK, when you get the fishing bug), early November is prime trout fishing season in the Great Smoky Mountains National Park and also on the local stocked and wild trout streams.



For those of you who have participated in FTW before, you know how much fun and great fellowship we have. You must call 865-448-3200 to reserve your room or suite for FTW. When you make you reservation by phone tell them you are attending FTW to get the discounted room rate. Please return the attached tier form to me with your preferred tying times. I am requesting that you only sign up for one tying session on Saturday, morning or afternoon. We will try to accommodate tiers that want to tie all day Saturday, but it will depend on how much space and tables we have available.

On Sunday this year we are again going to have one tying session from 9:00AM until 3:30PM to allow our tiers ample time for safe travel back home. You may tie for any part or all of Sunday's tying time if you desire. Just let me know so I can plan for table availability on Sunday.

If you have a preference for a tier you want to be seated next to, please inform me in your sign-up e-mail. I will accommodate your request if I can (This year we are not taking request to "not" be sitting by a certain tier. I don't want to be tying in a corner all by myself again..hahaha (2).

If this is your first time tying at FTW, please send me a 1 paragraph tying/fishing bio and a recent photo. If you have tied in FTW before and want to use your bio and photo on file, that is fine.

You are all such amazing and gifted fly tying artist. I am very much looking forward to seeing work your magic at the vice, listening to your fishing stories and fellowshipping with all of you at FTW 2022.


#### **Tennessee Fishing License Reminder**

#### **Casting for Recovery Fly Boxes**






